We recently sent a questionnaire out to our parents and carers, asking them to consider their child's experience over the last academic year as well as this year when completing the questionnaire. The questions we used are those asked by Ofsted under the ParentView website.

Thank you so much for your questionnaire responses and also for the written comments that some of you sent in. Out of the 78 questionnaires sent out, we received 30 responses, which is a return rate of 38%.

This year, we have maintained three opportunities for parent consultations per year as we have done in previous years. We hope that the information given out at these consultations will keep you informed about your child's progress and how you can help your child at home. One issue that was raised was regarding parental awareness of what the children are learning in school during the year. This information can be found on the school website and is updated each half term. You can find this within the 'Our Learning' section under the 'Our School Curriculum' tab. Here you will find a half termly topic web for each class in school detailing their learning in each area of the curriculum. Here you will also find a long term plan for the year for each key stage. Progression documents for all subjects are available on our website too. These documents are used by staff to identify and ensure progression in each area of the curriculum. It includes, curriculum coverage, skills progression and key vocabulary. If you have any questions regarding what your child is learning at school, please do not hesitate to speak to your child's class teacher.

Some parents may not be aware of how well we deal with bullying. We have an AntiBullying Lead in school, Helen Duffield, who is also one of our Designated Safeguarding Leads. If an incident occurs in school which might fall into a bullying category, then this is thoroughly investigated by Mrs Duffield following our AntiBullying Policy - please see the policies section on our website for further details. If bullying was deemed to have taken place, parents are also informed; children are supported, consequences put in place and the situation is actively monitored. We also have a continuous programme of preventative work to support children to follow our Rothbury rules, underpinned by the ethos of respect for all. If you have any further questions about this, please do ask.

Similarly, people may not be aware of how we deal with concerns. We have a formal Complaints Procedure, which you can find on our website, however we do aim to resolve any concerns raised through informal dialogue with yourselves. If you have any concerns, staff are available at the beginning and end of each day or alternatively you can email or call school and arrange to speak to the appropriate member of staff.
